HONESTY

Honesty means: Straightforward and truthful in words and actions.

The Powerful Word of the Month is honesty. Honesty means being straightforward and truthful in words and actions. It has been said that; "Honesty is more than not lying. It is truth telling, truth speaking, truth living, and truth loving" (James. E. Faust). In particular, honesty does not just encompass lying and truth-telling but also honesty vs cheating, stealing, omitions of the truth, plagiarizing and even flattery. While we seek honesty in our relationships, both business and personal, we also take liberties with this principle. So we will investigate, this month, when the truth is necessary and when we need to question its place when rivaling safety, kindness or even imaginative fun. We must teach those we guide that honesty with others and with ourselves is vital...except, of course, when it may not be advisable.

In particular, statistics show a dramatic increase in cheating among teenage students over the last 50 years. While cheating used to be seen as a practice exhibited by struggling students, it is now aboveaverage students who are engaging in this practice. What are your thoughts- why is this happening? **This week, your Powerful Thought assignment is to think through your view on cheating and how you would relay this view (as a leader) to others.**

A study out of Ohio State University relays that those who scored high on courage, empathy and honesty have a more positive view of others and are less likely than others to cheat. Although these people know the advantage of cheating, they don't do it. What is going on? How can we harness this truth? **This week, your Powerful Thought Assignment is to think through how we can guide those we lead to be honest even when there are advantages of dishonesty?**

This week, your Powerful Thought Assignment is to think about how often you tweak the truth to save someone's feelings or bolster their opinion? Where do you draw the line?
